## John Chapter 13

Passover. Jesus knew it was the time of the Sacrifice. Clear that it is out of love. His hour had come.

Eats the Seder; changes the ritual.

V 3-6: washes the apostles' feet. Order here is not completely clear. Not a miracle, act of humility and service. Example. Symbol of water. Why feet?

V 7-11: Peter's reaction. He doesn't want the Master to do this menial chore. It is for the lowest servant of a household. Jesus doing this for those that He has set apart; like us. Those that are His own. Greek means with those He has an ongoing relationship. He loves those that are in the world even though they are His enemies. They are washed except for their feet.

V 12-17: explains the example. It is a physical parable.

V 18-20: knew the betrayer. Fulfills Psalm 41:9. He lets the others know ahead of time. He and Judas ate together, walked together. Others could not tell. Not everyone who eats with Him is His disciple. Jesus shows He is the discerner of thoughts.

Jesus tells Judas to do his deed quickly. Troubled deeply in spirit. Grieved by sin. Apostles are concerned about who it is. Peter has John ask; he is the favorite. Leaning on His bosom. One who ate bread with Him fulfilled. Now Satan takes control of Judas.

V 31-35: now comes the Glory. This discourse begins AFTER Judas leaves. Now through the horrible suffering, He will be glorified. Now Satan will be defeated. God's Justice will be satisfied therefore the Father will be glorified. Ends of the Law. Jesus will be glorified **within** the Godhead. He calls them little children; tenderness, compassion. Love one another as I have loved you.
